First, more youth participated in our programs this year than ever before - 2,086! CFO has now served close to 13,000 youth.

Second, our partner network is growing by leaps and bounds – we have teamed with the NYC Department of Education's My Brother's/Sister's Keeper Initiative and will now be able to reach children through the public school system. Also, we are now working with all locations of Good Shepherd Services, one of the largest foster care agency network in NYC.

Third, our financial health is excellent. We exceeded our fundraising goals for the year by 30%. Which brings us to you...Our growth and ability to serve ever more children with ever better programming would not happen without you.

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
Kym was living in Georgia with her father and stepmother when her father was killed in a car accident. Her stepmother was not willing to keep Kym in her home, so Kym moved to NYC to be with her mother. Her mother is a drug addict and Kym was taken from her mother's home and put into foster care. Kym is one of the lucky children who was placed with an extraordinary foster parent.

This is when CFO came into Kym's life. When Kym was placed in her foster home, her case planner reached out to CFO to let us know of Kym's plight and of her interest in drama. Immediately, we set up acting lessons and an acting coach for Kym and she has been the recipient of several Arts Scholarships. Kym's talents and passion for the profession grew, as did her confidence and self-esteem. Along with her foster mom, Culture For One became -- and remains -- Kymberli's village.

Kym is now an A student at a charter school in Manhattan, she is a student representative on the highline, and represents youth on a Citywide Diversity and Inclusion Initiative. Her goal is to attend a prestigious acting school next year and Culture For One will support her throughout the audition process. Just last week Kym was accepted into a summer program at the Stella Adler Conservatory! CFO will provide the funding, including transportation and materials she needs for the program.

We have been able to provide the support she needs and deserves to reach her full unlimited potential, despite the hardships that life has sent her way.

NEW PARTNERS & CULTURAL CONNECTIONS





- In FY22, we expanded our network of partners and cultural connections by 20% and served over 2,000 youth.
- In FY23, we expect to serve 2,300 youth and families.

Our partnership with JCCA Pleasantville has expanded to JCCA citywide. Likewise, our partnership with the ACS Children's Center residential facility in Manhattan has now expanded citywide, offering cultural excursion to foster families.

Other new partnerships are: Children's Village in Dobb's Ferry, SCO in Queens, an agency that works with foster care families, and the Good Shepherd Services Blum and Sharpe group homes for teen boys.
